Ministers address Australia's largest Early Childhood conference

Federal Education Minister Dan Tehan MP and NSW Early Childhood and Indigenous Affairs Minister Sarah Mitchell will join a line-up of international and Australian experts in early childhood education and development. They will address Australia's largest gathering of early childhood professionals at the annual Early Childhood Australia National Conference from 19–22 September in Sydney.

This year the conference celebrates 80 years of continuous service by Early Childhood Australia (ECA) to the Australian community with the theme: *Be the difference for children and families*.

Today access to quality early learning is recognised as being crucial to children's development and key to lifelong outcomes. More than 2000 leaders and educators in the early childhood sector attend over 100 presentations, workshops, panels and concurrent sessions, and hear keynote addresses by:
