MODIFICATION

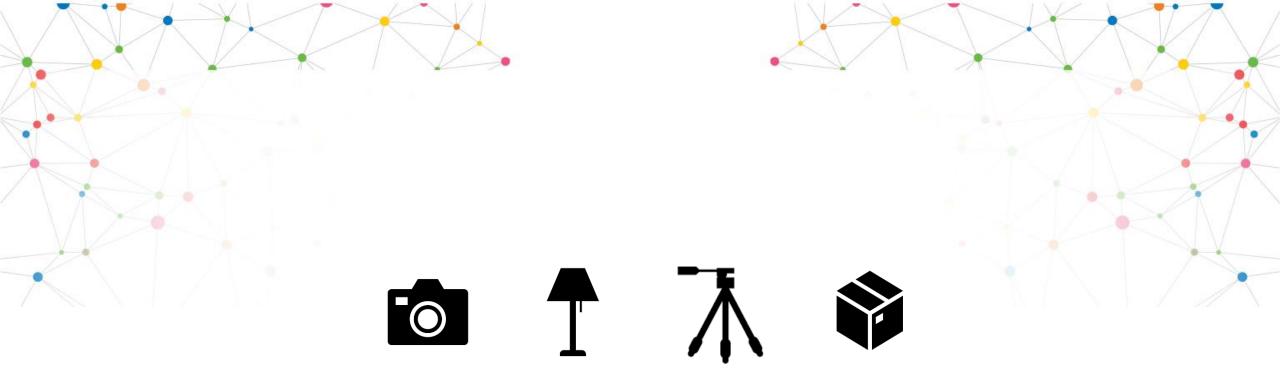
Technology allows for significant task redesign

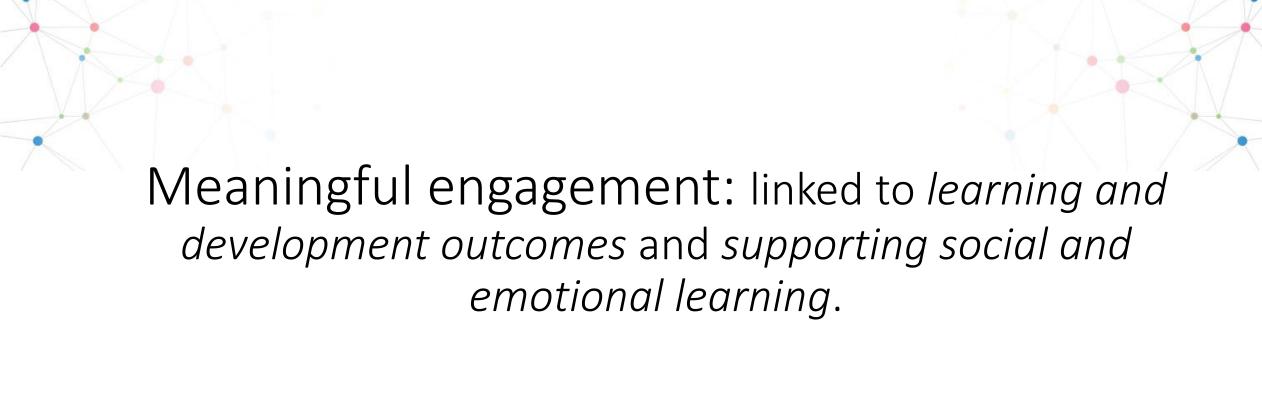
REDEFINITION

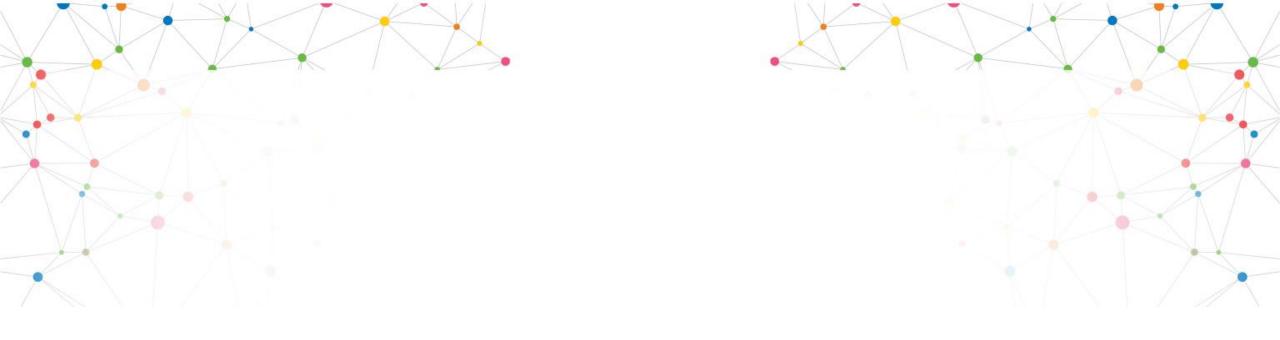
Technology allows for the creation of new tasks, previously inconceivable
