ECA WELCOMES LABOR'S COMMITMENT TO AFFORDABLE EARLY EDUCATION FOR ALL

Early Childhood Australia (ECA) is pleased to see the conversation about the importance of early education and care for children, families and the economy is continuing.

ECA CEO Samantha Page said measures to improve and simplify the Child Care Subsidy (CCS) for families using early education services are welcomed.

'While we commend the federal government for its Budget commitment to universal access to preschool for four-year-old's and improvements to the Child Care Subsidy (CCS), greater investment is needed to extend affordability to more families and address workforce issues,' said Ms Page.

'Labor's Cheaper Child Care plan goes a step further to support Australian families access highquality early education and care by lifting the CCS rate to 90% for all families, not only those with more than one child,' added Ms Page

'Investing in early education has significant flow-on benefits to the economy and parental workforce participation, but most importantly, investment in early education means every Australian child is given the best start in life.'

'Australia has the potential to have a world-class system that delivers high-quality early education to every young child, in every community, at an affordable cost for every family,' concluded Ms Page.
