Early Learning Matters Week is all about raising awareness and understanding of what high-quality early childhood education and care (ECEC) looks like, and all the ways it supports children's development and wellbeing.

Do you know an educator or an ECEC service that has gone above and beyond? Early Learning Matters Week is your opportunity to share!

This year, Early Childhood Australia's key advocacy initiative also has the support of the Minderoo Foundation's Thrive by Five campaign. There are lots of ways to participate:

- Hold an on-site celebration at your ECEC service.
- Talk with children about what they like about their early learning service.
- Invite members of parliament, local councillors or other community leaders to spend time at your service.
- Encourage families to participate in Early Learning Matters Week, too!
- Most importantly, share it all on social media! Tell everyone why early learning matters to you or why you are passionate about working in the profession.
