Early Learning Matters Week aims to recognise and raise the profile of early childhood education and care in children's development and wellbeing in Australia.

It is a great opportunity to tell our communities how high-quality early education and care supports children to be confident, enthusiastic learners, building a foundation for wellbeing and achievement throughout their lives, and all of this through play-based learning.

High-quality, play-based education and care supports young children to learn and thrive, with support from parents, carers and the wider community.
