Funding to deliver free online parenting resources

The Australian Government is providing \$40.6 million to Triple P International to help them deliver free online parenting education and mental health support to Australian parents and carers of children under 12. Learn more.

The Australian Government has announced emergency flood support until 8 November for more Local Government Areas in NSW and Victoria. While the emergency period in other regions of NSW, Victoria and Tasmania ended on 1 November 2022, support is still available. State and territory news

NSW

As part of a \$46.8 million investment over four years by the NSW Government, 87 trained School Wellbeing Nurses are now providing care and support to students in approximately 300 rural, regional and metropolitan schools across NSW. Details here.

Applications for the revamped Quality and Participation Grants are open until 14 November 2022 to support eligible ECEC services improve learning environments, increase community outreach and meet costs associated with implementing recent reforms. Learn more.

NT

The Northern Territory Education and Care Awards have been announced. The awards celebrate an educator, service or program that demonstrates an exceptional commitment to improving the lives and outcomes of NT children and their families. View the recipients' list here.

Old

From 2023, the Qld Government will be offering low-cost kindergarten for many families as part of a \$1 billion investment in kindergarten. About 40,000 families will benefit from either free or cheaper kindergarten. More details here.

The Qld Government has released some new video case studies to address their annual regulatory priorities of adequate supervision and positive interactions with children. Explore these and other regulatory resources on their website here.

SA

The SA Government is boosting vocational pathways into ECEC in preparation for the introduction of universal three-year-old preschool. Findon Technical College will offer vocational programs for careers in ECEC. Details here.

SA Premier Peter Malinauskas MP to attend the Margaret Trembath Research Scholarship presentation – 'Our Stories: Children and Celebrations' – about how celebrations are talked about, defined and enacted by children and their educators in early childhood settings. Register here.

Vic

The Vic. Government is helping families across the state to access better kindergarten services through the latest round of the Building Blocks grants. The government has committed to invest \$14.7 million to build four new kindergartens and help four existing services expand. Read more.

The Mental Health in Primary Schools program, which received \$200 million to expand to every government and low-fee non-government primary school in Victoria, will be scaled up across the state from next year. Details here.

The Vic. Government has committed to invest \$77.3 million towards the Health and Education Recovery Fund, which will include support to an estimated 320 schools affected by the floods, alongside a support package for TAFE students. Learn more.

WA

The Specialist Learning Program (SLP) for students with autism in WA will be expanded to eight additional locations starting with the rollout to Hampton Park Primary School and Hampton Senior High School in Term 2 next year. Read here.
